**25 YEARS AFTER KOHUT...NEW GENERATIONS, NEW DIRECTIONS**

Dear Colleagues

The program for this 29th Annual International Conference on the Psychology of the Self explores significant changes in self psychology since Heinz Kohut last addressed this Conference over 25 years ago. These changes are addressed in the main panels of the Conference in four distinct areas: Evolving Perspectives on the Selfobject Transference, Panel 1; on The Self, Panel 2; on Evolving Perspectives on Interpretation, Panel 3; and on Forms and Transformations of Narcissism, Panel 4. We are delighted to have as guest participants Jody Messier Davies, Carlo Strenger, and Arnold Goldberg.

Beginning with a day-long Pre-Conference on Thursday, participants may choose, from among twelve alternatives, one morning session and one afternoon session, with each session addressing the Conference theme from a different vantage point. In the morning, Jeffrey Stern, Allen Kodish, Frank Summers, and Marcia Dobson will present a panel on a therapeutic journey; George Hagman and Carol M. Press will lead a workshop on creativity, architecture, and Frank Lloyd Wright; Estelle Shane and Lucyann Canton will present methods of conceptualizing and clinically applying psychoanalytic theories of provision; Judith Pickles and Joye Weisel-Barth will help writers bring clinical and theoretical materials to life on page; Allen Siegel will initiate an all-day class on basic Self Psychology; and Marian Tolpin, Frank Lachmann, Paula Fuqua, and Elizabeth Feldman will consider the forward edge and leading edge transferences.

Then, in the afternoon, master class supervisions will be led by Shelley Doctors and Alan Kindler; a workshop on the contributions of child analytic treatment to the development of self psychology and adult treatment will be led by Mark Smaller, Rosalind Chaplin Kindler, Jacqueline Gotthold, Iris Hilke, and Doriene Sorter; a workshop on the application of psychoanalytic concepts to couples psychotherapy will be led by Carla Leone and David Shaddock; a self psychological perspective on learning disabilities and its effects on adults and therapy will be presented by Margaret Amerongen, Margaret Baker, Myrna Orenstein, and Joseph Palombo; an exploration of the contributions of contemporary self psychological and relational understandings to analytic endings will be presented by James Fosshage, Kenneth Frank, George Moraitis, Estelle Shane, and Sandra Hershberg; and Allen Siegel will conclude his day-long course on basic Self Psychology.

On Thursday evening the main conference begins by featuring a rare film of Heinz Kohut discussing his thoughts about the need for a psychology of the self, with David Terman providing a keynote lecture on the broad theoretical background of the four clinical panels to follow. Panel One, on Friday morning, *Evolving Perspectives on the Selfobject Transference*, with James Fisch and Peter Buirski presenting, Susanna Federici-Nebbiosi moderating, and Amy Eldridge presenting a case. Panel Two, on Friday afternoon, will analyze *The Self* with Richard Geist and Jody Messier-Davies presenting, and Ronald Bodansky moderating. Panel Three, on Saturday morning, will examine *Interpretation*, with Anna Ornstein and Shelley Doctors presenting, and Jill Gardner moderating. Finally, Panel Four, on Sunday morning, will feature *Forms and Transformations of Narcissism* with Carlo Strenger and Frank Lachmann presenting, and Estelle Shane moderating.

Following the presentation of each of the first three panels, the participants will be divided into small groups for discussion of the material presented, led by senior faculty. Following the fourth panel, Judith Guss Teicholz will present the Plenary Summation, ending the conference. In addition to the main panels, 24 original paper and workshop sessions will be offered, twelve on Saturday early afternoon, and twelve on Saturday late afternoon.

Paul Ornstein will deliver the Kohut Memorial Lecture, "Heinz Kohut's Self Psychology and Ours: Transformations of Psychoanalysis." He will be introduced by James Fisch.

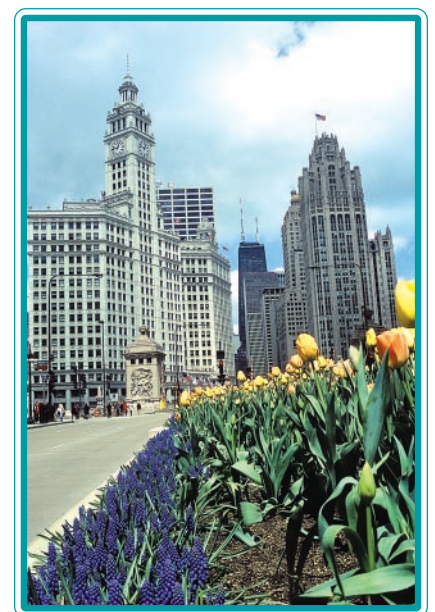
